Facilities and procedures will be adjusted accordingly to the extent possible to ensure standard preventative measures.

NWCTC students and staff returned to full time live instruction in the 2021-2022 school year and will continue into subsequent school years. In the event that a school closure is necessary, students will have access to asynchronized instruction via virtual methods such as google classroom and live synchronized instruction via Zoom and Teams. Students that do not have internet access will be offered the ability to receive written packets.

Educational models will continue to be adjusted as necessary to meet students' educational needs. NWCTC's sending schools provide counselors to assist in meeting needs for students' emotional and mental health needs. NWCTC's employee assistance program is available to meet the needs of staff member's social and emotional needs. Additional resources for staff's well being will continue to be analyzed and implemented when available. Health and food services are provided by the individual student's home school districts. NWCTC will assist in facilitating these services upon the request of the sending school district.
